



# Map showing promoted sites for development in and around Basingstoke including Strategic Sites



Very good news that, at this first draft at least, the map shows no allocated development sites locally or across the majority of the Loddon Valley. For Mapledurwell, the 'APPENDIX C: Assessment of settlements' says:

'Mapledurwell spreads across a large area, and is largely triangular in shape. The village consists of large residential plots, a number of which cluster to the north and south, with large breaks in the village frontage along Tunworth Road and Frog Lane making the village dispersed in character. The majority of the village is designated as a conservation area.

'The two Key Services and Facilities are not well- related to each other or the built form, with the local pub being some distance to the south from the main area of housing, and the hall being to the north. The surrounding area is very rural in nature, with limited road infrastructure or footways and narrow single track, country lanes, particularly to the southern part of the village. The built form is broken up by land in agricultural use or undeveloped countryside. The settlement is not suitable for inclusion within the settlement hierarchy.'

This is consistant with previous assessments.

Very good news that, at this first draft at least, the map shows no allocated development sites locally or across the majority of the Loddon Valley.

To note for Newnham, the 'APPENDIX C: Assessment of settlements' says:

'Newnham comprises scattered dwellings loosely clustered around the village green in the centre of the village. The openness of the village green and the surrounding area is a key characteristic of the village and contributes to the heritage significance of its conservation area (and other heritage assets) and results in a dispersed built form. There is no bus route which serves the settlement directly, and it doesn't have a clear central area or concentration of the built form which the key facilities or services may serve. The main road (Newnham Road) running through the settlement has no pavement. The settlement would not be suitable for an SPB (Settlement Policy Boundary) and should not be included in the settlement hierarchy.'

This again is good news and is consistent with the previous Regulation 18 Draft. For the 2020 Issues & Options consultation, Newnham was assessed differently due to its access to services.

### FROM THE BENEFICE MINISTRY TEAM

Dear Friends
If you have ever spent any time in France or with

French people you will know that traditionally the French have placed great value on good manners – this particularly includes how to say 'Hello' or 'Goodbye'. When you leave a restaurant or a shop, other diners or other shoppers will often say 'Au Revoir Monsieur/Madame' when you make your way to the door.

In the UK, we are much less attentive to these moments of transition. Some people are really good at saying 'Goodbye'. They know exactly what to say to or to do and the moment passes well and comfortably. But many can feel awkward and can struggle to know what to say. Some simply want to leave quietly. Others want to run away as quickly as possible.

Saying 'Goodbye' can be a celebration of good things that have happened. It can mark the end of a lovely evening with friends and family. It can mark the end of a holiday or a school year or the end of a job. It can mark moving house to another part of the country or even the death of a loved one. It can also mark the beginning of new opportunities or possibilities.

In many ways saying 'Goodbye' marks some sort of bereavement – an ending or the closing of a chapter. The more important the chapter in

our lives, the more significant the bereavement.

Bereavement can involve a sense of loss, failure, confusion, anger or resignation before a new way of being starts to emerge.

St Paul, the writer of so many of the *New Testament* letters excelled at saying 'Goodbye'. Often the whole last chapter of his letters was dedicated to greetings, to saying thank you, to looking ahead to the future, and prayer for the glory of God and the extension of his kingdom.

Saying 'Goodbye' well can be really important. Not least because it enables us to make space for the future. Tip 7 of the book, *Seven Helpful Tips for Saying Goodbye*, says that '... saying goodbye well helps us to fully say hello to the New Thing'.

The Christian faith is very much an Easter faith – a faith of new beginnings – a faith of letting go of the old and taking hold of the new.

This Autumn, Gary and I will be saying goodbye to the North Hampshire Downs Benefice. We will undoubtedly feel the sadness of the letting go and at times may struggle to know what to say. But at the same time we will be praying for new possibilities and opportunities for those who fill the space we leave behind in North Hampshire - for resurrection and for new life, to the glory of God and the extension of his kingdom.

# A guide to the household canvass for 2025

From August to November, BDBC conducts its annual canvass of properties within the borough.

This is to ensure the Electoral Register is accurate and up to date. A revised register will be published on 01 December 2025.

The Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) is required to follow the process as set out in law.

### How the process works...

#### STEP 1 DATA MATCHING

In July, the Electoral Register was sent to the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) to be matched against their records. The name and address of each elector is verified against National Insurance databases and information held by DWP. The ERO has the discretion to use local data (such as Council Tax) to perform a matching exercise.

If all the registered electors at a property can be matched, the property will be assigned to 'Route 1' canvass.

If there are any electors at a property who cannot be matched, or the property is empty, the property will be assigned to 'Route 2' canvass.

('Route 3' canvass is for care homes, nursing homes and other properties with a duty manager.)

#### STEP 2 CONTACTING YOU 'Route 1' Canvass

For Route 1, if you've registered an email address with BDBC Electoral Services, on 19 August you will have received an email with a link to your property details on the 'household response' website.

The email will include two security codes, needed along with your postcode, to access the site. You can respond online up to 10 September to confirm or change the details BDBC hold for the property. But if you add a new person to the property, they must complete their own registration. They can register to vote online at the Government website or call BDBC, 01256 845467.

If you have received an email but not responded online by 10 Sept, a paper form will be automatically generated. If BDBC doesn't hold your email address, they will as a matter of course send a paper form with the current elector details listed. All paper forms for Route 1 will be dispatched on 22 September.

If the information on the hard copy form is correct, you don't need to do anything more. To make changes, use the security codes on the form to access the household response website (as procedure outlined above for email contact) – or complete the paper form and return it to Electoral Services, Civic Offices, London Road, B/stoke RG21 4AH.

# STEP 2: CONTACTING YOU

#### 'Route 2' Canvass

For those on the 'Route 2' canvass there isn't an option to receive the form via email. You'll receive a form in the post – dispatched by BDBC on 27 August – with steps to follow as for Route 1 above.

Again you can respond online at www.householdresponse.com/basingstoke or complete and return the paper form. To note, the return envelopes will be addressed to BDBC partners Civica Election Services, London, N81 1ER.

For 'Route 2' canvass you need to respond even if there are no changes. If you've not submitted a response by 22 September, a reminder letter and form will be sent on 30 September. You then have until 15 October to reply.

For any forms still outstanding, BDBC 'Canvassers' will visit at some time between 17 October and 28 November – they will have a clear Basingstoke & Deane ID badge. There is then the option to respond online or directly to the Canvasser.

It is a legal requirement for properties in Route 2 to respond to the annual canvass.
